BAXTER SPRINGS, Kan. — A local family knows all to well about the nearly 100,000 service men and women who are missing or unidentified.

Navy Fireman First Class Hadley Heavin was 23-years-old when he left Kansas and was sent to Pearl Harbor during World War II.

His ship was bombed-his family would never see him again-until now.

Honored Saturday by the Kansas Governor, fellow service men and women, and the community as he's laid to rest, some 80 years later.

It was a service-fit for a hero.

"Hadley, he was a great man, he loved everyone of us.", says brother Rex Heavin.

From the time he put on his first pair of boxing gloves, everyone knew Hadley Heavin was a fighter.

"He was a prize fighter. You had to be pretty fast to beat him. I know he hit me a couple of times, not hard." says Hadley's brother Charles "Frog" Heavin.

Fighting for his family and his country is what made Heavin who he was.

"They quit school in the 8th grade to help support the family. He also enlisted in the Navy because of his allegiance to the United States." said Linda Price, Heavin's niece. He was killed at Pearl Harbor and he was on the USS West Virginia.

It's been 79 years since Navy Fireman First Class Hadley Heavin was killed in the attack on Pearl Harbor.

Janet Carr, Heavin's niece says "It's kind of like it's kind of real, kind of surreal." In November, we met his nieces shortly after they learned he'd be returning home after his remains were identified through DNA in 2017.

"We never met him and so we didn't miss him until actually all of this started", says Linda.

"We listened to their stories for all these years as if we did know him", added Janet. But now he's back home, in Baxter Springs Kansas.

Where he's being laid to rest in a ceremony-fit for a hero.

"It is truly my honor, to be here in Baxter Springs to pay respects to Fireman First Class Hadley Irvin Heavin a brave member of the United States Navy, who made the ultimate sacrifice." said Kansas Governor Laura Kelly, who attended the service.

Hadley's memory has been kept alive for over 78 years, by his brothers and sisters, and families.

And with one final salute, his family hopes his legacy continues.

"And we got him back and it was a miracle but we got him back. God does miracles."

tight end. This picture is after back to back games, three hours of playing non-stop, with his dad Kevin (Jeanne Bryant's son).


Summer Snackpacks
